Title: "Advent is Coming...How Will We know?"

Theologian Karl Barth once said that we are to hold the Bible in one hand and the proverbial newspaper in the other. As we are attuned to what is happening in the world around us, the social and political landscapes both differ from and mirror the life that surrounded Jesus. Just like those we read about in the Advent scriptures, we too have questions...many questions. As is the case too often, questions in the church are cast aside, and those who ask them are left feeling alone and lonely. But Advent is a time to lean into our questions. To wonder and wander and wait together for the Messiah, the Christ child, the Light.

This Advent, which begins Sunday, December 3<sup>rd</sup>, we will explore the question, "How will <u>we</u> know?" While we don't aim to come up with definitive answers, we do challenge each other to lean into the ways that our faith invites us to sit together, to discern the times, and to watch and wait. Even when we have questions and doubts, it's good to be reminded that God is still with us; still then, God is working. Advent is a time when we wait together and search for clues of the work that God is doing in our midst.

Our themes for Advent this year will be:

**December 3**: "How will we know...how long?" When the answer is not forthcoming, how do we wait?

**December 10**: "How will we know...what now?" What are we called to do in the midst of waiting?

**December 17:** "How will we know...what's next?" How do we find hope and joy in the questions of faith that may lead not to answers, but more questions?

**December 24:** "How will we know...why not me?" Come celebrate the birth of Christ through song, scripture and candle lighting.

**December 31:** "How will we know...who knows?" A time to recognize the signs of God's work all around us and celebrate the faithfulness of God.

**January 7:** (Epiphany): "How will we know...what we know?" Christmas has ended, but our questions remain. How are we to be witnesses to Christ's birth?

As we prepare our hearts for Messiah's grand entrance, may our souls sing out just as the prophets did so long ago, "I wait for the Lord, my soul awaits, and in his word, I hope." (Psalm 130:5)
