#### **VOLUNTEERS**

When is it ok to return to your volunteer assignment after you have tested positive for COVID? Per CDC guidance, after testing positive for COVID you should plan not to return to your volunteer assignment for 10 days. On day 11, you may return to work without testing if you have been fever free for at least 24 hours without taking fever-reducing medication. If you want to return sooner, you can return on day 7 with a negative COVID test and you must wear a KN95 mask through day 10 or until you are symptom free. You must also be fever free for at least 24 hours without taking fever reducing medications. The KN95 masks can be found in the volunteer offices as well as the nurse's stations. Regardless of where you are volunteering, if you are still

experiencing symptoms (like a cough) on the day you return, you will need to wear a KN95 mask.
