The IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) allows, once you have reached the age of 70½, to donate up to \$105,000 within each tax year directly from your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) without treating the distribution as taxable income. The contribution can be counted toward satisfying your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) for the year, if applicable. You don't pay taxes on the gift, and it may lower your taxable income. Here are the steps you can take to make a distribution:

Contact your retirement administrator to notify them you would like to donate all or a portion of your IRA directly to Living Branches Foundation.

The Art of Listening

God has blessed us with several senses with which to learn from our environment, touch, taste, smell, seeing and hearing. Some have noticed as we grow older that some of our ability to use our senses has diminished, but thankfully we have aids, such as hearing devices and glasses to give us support.

The sense of hearing is related to the art of listening because we need the physical ability to hear what another person is saying in order to listen to them. However, I would suggest that we also need our heart and mind to listen to another person. It is not always an easy task to really listen to the other, particularly when we might disagree with them or think we have advice to offer.

I have been challenged by a billboard on my drive home these last few months with a photo of two girls who look like twins with their backs to each other and their heads together, with the tag line: "The other person might be right." LISTENING I really appreciate this message because it is a reminder to consider the perspective of others.

The Living Branches pastoral team will be sharing a series of messages this fall on the fruit of the Spirit with the purpose of encouraging us to live by the Holy Spirit's power, demonstrating a Christ-like attitude as we interact with others. We believe listening is one of the ways we demonstrate the fruit of the Spirit, love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, gentleness, goodness, faithfulness, and self-control. As we listen to each other, the invitation is to listen with a goal of understanding rather than just formulating my response to what they are saying. I have noticed that listening with compassion and kindness builds a sense of community with my neighbor.

Jesus calls us to love our neighbor as ourselves. When we stop to listen to the other person, we will be open to learning. Perhaps one place we can all start is to learn to listen to ourselves first and to identify what we are feeling and thinking. That may help us to love our neighbor well too.

As we go through this season of elections and change may we practice loving our neighbors as ourselves through the art of listening. May the fruit of the Spirit be evident in our community as we eat, play, learn and share life together and practice the art of listening. *Pastoral Care Team*
